



California university students China murder suspect convicted eventually sentenc

American man Javier Borden (Javier Bolden) on suspicion of the murder in 2012 two University of Southern California Chinese students, 25 this month, was found guilty of first-degree murder and.

In April 11, 2012, the United States of Losangeles Chinese students studying at the University of Southern California Qu Ming and Wu Ying was shot to death outside, in this, the 22 year old Bolden pleaded not guilty. But then he told fellow inmates revealed details of the crime were exposed, in view of the evidence is sufficient, the first-degree murder was eventually sentenced to.

In 2012 the Chinese students murder case has aroused extensive attention in China and the international community on the safety of students. It is understood that the University of Southern California is located in regions with a high incidence of crime rates, and school students 20%.
