

Columbia rebels to release government army general gate or restart peace talks

Columbia rebels of the revolutionary armed forces of Columbia (FARC) released in November 30th by the seizure of a Columbia government army generals and two other hostages, peace talks which will lead to the re start to remain stagnant.

According to the International Committee of the Red Cross says, Lubin Dario al Sutter, general (Rub e n Dar o Alzate) and other two hostages in the countryside area Columbia Western was transferred to the intermediate people -- Cuba and the Norway government and the Red Cross representatives, followed by helicopters were sent to Columbia second largest city of Medellin, where the hostages were handed over to the to Columbia military. Alzate is a brigadier general, had led a Columbia anti hijacking forces, now in command of an army of 2500 men against the rebels in the army.

Two weeks ago the high-profile kidnappings between the Colombian government and FARC peace talks in the moment of Havana to a standstill. President Santos immediately suspended the negotiations also requires FARC to release al Sutter as hostages, and ordered the reason of military investigation al general Sutter violated a peace agreement to venture into rebel territory.
